#### PESTICIDE APPLICATION NOTIFICATION REQUEST

#### **DEAR PARENT, GUARDIAN & SCHOOL STAFF,**

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, Effective July 2001 requires all public and non-public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Dansville Central School District is now required to maintain a list of persons in parental relations, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are **not** subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas in inaccessible to children:
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less
  when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects
  including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

The State Education law provides that all children in New York State in proper physical and mental condition between the ages of 6 through the year in which they turn 16 shall attend school while it is in session.

Parents are requested to call school the morning that their child is absent and state the reason for the absence.

All children absent from school must, upon their return, furnish school authorities with a written excuse stating the reasons for their absence. Excuses must be dated and signed by the childes parent or guardian.

A student who has an unexcused absence during the day may not attend any after-school function on that day.

If parents want a child excused during the day, they must send a written request from home. Parents must come to the main office to sign out children.

#### **Emergency School Closings**

Notice of emergency school closing (due to storm conditions, etc.) will be given over radio station WDNY and TV Channels 2, 8, 10, and 13. No private, parochial or public school transportation will be provided when Dansville Schools are closed.

#### **Open Meetings Law and Freedom of Information Act**

Dansville Central School district complies with the Open Meetings law and the Freedom of Information Act in the conduct of business of the district.

#### **AHERA**

AHERA is a federal law enacted in 1987 which requires all school districts to re-inspect facilities for asbestos-containing building materials. Our facilities have been inspected and response actions are planned to insure the continued safe environment for our students and employees. Activities include training of staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos and periodic re-inspection and surveillance activities by trained personnel. Details of such activities are described in the districtor AHERA Management Plan, which is available for review.

#### **Student Directory Information**

Under the Family Education Rights & Privacy Act (FERPA), the District must provide notice to parents of the types of student information that it releases publicly. The District may disclose directory information in official school publications and on its web site. This type of information, commonly referred to as õdirectory information,ö which is released by the District includes, but is not limited to, such items as:

Parent or guardian name;

Student name, date and place of birth;

Student grade level;

Student major field of study;

Student participation in officially recognized activities and sports;

Student height and weight if member of an athletic team;

Student dates of attendance in this District;

Student degrees and awards received;

Studenton most recently attended previous educational agency/institution; Studenton photograph, image or likeness.

Parent and eligible students have the right to refuse the release of student directory information. They must notify the Building Principal by September 30. If neither office has heard from you by October 1, the District may release such information to an outside group without individual consent.

Federal law requires that the District provide access to secondary student names, addresses and telephone listings upon a request by military recruiters. Under federal law, any secondary student or parent of a secondary student may request that such information not be released without prior parental consent. The District is required to comply with parents who choose this õopt outö option.

#### **Sexual Harassment**

The district is committed to safeguarding the right of all students within the school district to learn in an environment that is free from all forms of sexual harassment. Conduct is deemed to be sexual harassment when the student perceives behavior as unwelcome, such as inappropriate touching, verbal comments, sexual name calling, spreading sexual rumors, gestures, jokes, pictures, blocking a studentø movement, rape or attempted rape. Sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination. Any student who believes that he or she has been subjected to sexual harassment, whether by a teacher, other student, or any individual on school grounds or at school activities, should report the alleged misconduct immediately to the Superintendent, the Title IX Compliance Officer. The student can pursue his/her complaint informally or file a formal complaint.

In the absence of a victimos complaint the school, upon learning of or having reason to suspect the occurrence of any sexual harassment, will promptly begin an investigation.

To file a complaint or grievance, these procedures should be followed:

Try to reach an informal solution to the problem by discussing the incident with the appropriate teacher, staff member or Superintendent.

If no solution is reached, a written grievance should be filed within thirty (30) days of the incident with the Compliance Officer or designee. An investigation will take place by the Compliance Officer.

A finding in writing will be made within fifteen (15) days and a resolution proposed.

If there is dissatisfaction with the finding or resolution, the complainant may file a written request for review by the Board of Education. The request must be filed within 15 days with the District Clerk.

The Superintendent shall submit all written statements and other materials concerning the case to the President of the Board.

The Board shall hold a hearing within fifteen (15) school days of receiving the request. All parties concerned shall have the right to present further statements and testimony at such a hearing.

The Board shall render a decision in writing within fifteen (15) days after the hearing has concluded.

#### Title IX

In compliance with Federal Title IX regulations, the Dansville Central School District has adopted policies stating they do not discriminate on the basis of sex in educational programs or activities or in employment. Inquiries relative to the Title IX compliance may be directed to the Superintendent of Schools.

#### **Public Complaints**

The Board of Education recognizes the right of the community members to register individual or group concerns regarding instruction, district programs, materials, operations, discrimination due to sex and/or disability, and/or staff members. The main goal of this district is to resolve such concerns with only the parties involved, whenever possible. Public complaints about the school district will be directed to the staff member concerned. If the matter is not settled satisfactorily, the complainant shall then contact the Building Principal and the Superintendent. If there is no resolution on this level, the Superintendent shall refer the issue to the Board for final resolution.

#### Smoke Free Environment

In accordance with New York State Law, the use of tobacco or tobacco related products (:chewing@tobacco, e-cigarettes) is not allowed in our school buildings or on our grounds. Students and adults must abide by this law at all times. Spectators at school events held outside are included. Please help us follow state and federal laws and reduce the health hazards associated with smoking.

#### Records Access

By law, taxpayers have a right to obtain certain school records. If you would like to inspect or obtain a copy of a record, A Records Access Request Form can be completed in the District Office. If your request is approved and you would like copies, there is a 25 cents per copy charge.

### Information Regarding Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

Section 504 is an Act which prohibits discrimination against persons with a handicap in any program receiving Federal financial assistance. The Act defines a person with a handicap as anyone who:

Has a mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activity (such as caring for one self, performing manual tasks, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, learning and working);

Has record of such an impairment; or

Is regarded as having such an impairment.

In order to fulfill its obligation under Section 504, the Dansville Central School District recognizes a responsibility to avoid discrimination in policies and practices regarding its personnel and students. No discrimination against any person with a handicap will knowingly be permitted in any of the programs and practices in the school system.

#### Board of Education District Policy Prohibited Student Conduct- 5300.30

The Board of Education expects all students to conduct themselves in an appropriate and civil manner, with proper regard for the rights and welfare of other students, district personnel and other members of the school community, and for the care of school facilities and equipment.

The best discipline is self-imposed, and students must learn to assume and accept responsibility for their own behavior, as well as the consequences of their misbehavior. District personnel who interact with students are expected to use disciplinary action only when necessary and to place emphasis on educating students so that they may grow in self-discipline.

The Board recognizes the need to make its expectations for student conduct while on school property or engaged in a school function specific and clear. The rules of conduct listed below are intended to do that and focus on safety and respect for the rights and property of others. Students who will not accept responsibility for their own behavior and who violate these school rules will be required to accept the consequences for their conduct.

Students may be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including suspension from school, when they:

- A: Engage in conduct that is disorderly
- B: Engage in conduct that is insubordinate
- C: Engage in conduct that is disruptive
- D: Engage in conduct that is violent
- E. Engage in any conduct that endangers the safety, physical or mental health or welfare of others
- F. Engage in misconduct while on a school bus
- G. Engage in any form of academic misconduct
- H. Engage in off-campus misconduct that interferes with, or can reasonably be expected to substantially disrupt the educational process in the school or a school function

**District Policy- 5300.40** Discipline is most effective when it deals directly with the problem at the time and place it occurs, and in a way that students view as fair and impartial. School personnel who interact with students are expected to use disciplinary action only when necessary and to place emphasis on students' ability to grow in self-discipline.

Disciplinary action, when necessary, will be firm, fair and consistent so as to be most effective in changing student behavior. In determining the appropriate disciplinary action, school personnel authorized to impose disciplinary penalties will consider the following:the student's age, the nature of the offense and the circumstances which led to the offense, the student's prior disciplinary record, the effectiveness of other forms of discipline, information from parents, teachers and/or others, as appropriate, other extenuating circumstances.

As a general rule, discipline will be progressive. This means that a student's first violation will usually merit a lighter penalty than subsequent violations.

If the conduct of a student is related to a disability or suspected disability, the student shall be referred to the Committee on Special Education and discipline, if warranted, shall be administered consistent with the separate requirements of this code of conduct for disciplining students with a disability or presumed to have a disability. A student identified as having a disability shall not be disciplined for behavior related to his/her disability, unless the discipline is consistent with the student's individualized education plan (IEP). Refer to District Policy 5300.50

The DHS Code of Conduct uses progressive discipline. It is broken down into first, second, third, and additional incidents, each warranting further consequences. Example:

#### Most common infractions 2015-2016:

#### Tardy to School

We expect all students to arrive on time for all classes. Students should be in their first period class by 7:50. Tardiness is defined as the failure to be in the room and sitting in your seat or prepared to begin when the second bell stops ringing. Individual expectations may be set by the teacher as part of their expectations for student behavior in class.

#### Insubordination/Gross Insubordination

All students are expected to respond in a timely and respectful manner to all reasonable directives from an adult. Insubordination, or willful defiance, is defined as the refusal to follow the reasonable directives of any staff members.

#### Inappropriate Behavior

All students are expected to follow school rules, respect the rights of students and staff, and to resolve conflicts in a positive way. Inappropriate behaviors occur when students violate a school rule, or when a student's actions interfere with teaching, learning, and/or another's personal rights.

#### Failed to Attend Assigned Detention/ Teacher Appointment

All students are expected to attend assigned detentions/teacher appointments, and to arrive at their scheduled start time.

#### Profanity/Obscene Acts/Obscene Gestures

- Least-Profanity used almost involuntarily as an expletive, or casually in conversation. Use of words which are considered offensive and inconsiderate.
- Moderately-Moderately severe profanity used deliberately, in a discussion or dispute with a student or staff member, or used as a point of emphasis. Use of words which are considered distasteful and insulting.
- Most Severe- Most severe profanity is used to threaten, attack, or to challenge authority. Profanity
  directed toward a student or staff member intended to publicly abuse, humiliate and/or hurt the
  victim. Use of words or gestures which are considered uncivilized, disturbing, and repugnant.

#### Reckless/Dangerous/Disruptive Behavior Minor/Moderate/Severe Infraction

- Minor-Minor infractions are defined as behaviors that do not have the potential for serious physical
  injury and present a minor disruption. Examples may include, but are not limited to running in the
  halls or yelling.
- Moderate-Moderate infractions are defined as behaviors that may cause physical harm, property
  damage, or disrupt the learning environment. Examples include, but are not limited to standing on
  tables, squealing tires, horseplay in the halls or classroom, cafeteria, or any learning environment.
- Severe-Severe infractions are defined as behaviors that may cause severe physical injury, substantial
  property damage, or substantially disrupt the learning environment. Examples include, but are not
  limited to, speeding or erratic driving on school property, being in areas that could lead to severe
  physical injury, or climbing out of windows.

#### PARENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS FOR STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AND SECURITY

The Dansville School District, in recognition of the risk of identity theft and unwarranted invasion of privacy, affirms its commitment to safeguarding student personally identifiable information (PII) in educational records from unauthorized access or disclosure in accordance with State and Federal law. The Dansville School District establishes the following parental bill of rights:

Student PII will be collected and disclosed only as necessary to achieve educational purposes in accordance with State and Federal Law.

A student's personally identifiable information cannot be sold or released for any commercial purposes by a third party contractor. The district will not sell student personally identifiable information and will not release it for commercial purposes, other than directory information released by the district in accordance with district policy;

Parents have the right to inspect and review the complete contents of their child's education record (for more information about how to exercise this right, see 5500-R);

State and federal laws protect the confidentiality of personally identifiable information. Safeguards associated with industry standards and best practices, including but not limited to, encryption, firewalls, and password protection, must be in place when data is stored or transferred;

A complete list of all student data elements collected by the State Education Department is available for public review at <a href="http://www.p12.nysed.gov/irs/sirs/">http://www.p12.nysed.gov/irs/sirs/</a>.

Parents have the right to have complaints about possible breaches of student data addressed. In the event that the District engages a third party provider to deliver student educational services, the contractor or subcontractors will be obligated to adhere to State and Federal Laws to safeguard student PII. 


