Goal 1: How will the LEA foster effective Parent Involvement strategies and support partnerships among school, parents and the community to improve student achievement?

The principal of each school will designate one certified staff member (who shall receive supplemental pay for the assigned duties as required by law) who is willing to serve as a parent facilitator to:

- * Promote and encourage a welcoming atmosphere to foster parental involvement in the schools.

Goal 3: How will the district build the school's capacity for strong parent involvement?

The North Little Rock School District will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement plan in improving the quality of its Title I, Part A schools. As parents learn how to navigate it the hope is that it will be much easier than the previous one. An additional help to the families is an app for the website and eschool. Those parents who are using both of these seem to enjoy having the information at their fingertips and find what they need.
