PROMOTION AND RETENTION

Promotion and/or retention of students shall be as prescribed by procedures established by the Superintendent of Schools in consultation with various members of the professional staff, subject to review by the Board of Education. In the development of such procedures, consideration shall be given to the recommendations of the classroom teachers, the involvement of the Building Principal, and the utilization of the services of guidance personnel. Primary consideration shall be given to the ultimate welfare of the child. Decisions involving promotion and retention shall take into consideration the individual ability of the child and his/her emotional and physical maturity.

As a general rule, no student shall be retained in one grade level for a maximum of two years. Under no circumstances shall retention be used as a disciplinary measure.

No student shall be retained unless a conference has been held in which the reasons for retention and the likely success of such retention are discussed with the parents/guardians and the principal.

Acceleration, or advancing a student more than one grade level, shall be used sparingly when special circumstances warrant.

The district administration shall develop regulations to implement this policy, which shall include an appeals process concerning a decision to promote, retain or accelerate a student.

The final decision shall be made by the principal consistent with policy IKF, Graduation Requirements which supersedes this policy.
