Barton High School parents can access their child's grades using a PIN number they received at the beginning of the school year. Mrs. Monique Miller, our high school counselor, will give parents the PIN number to view their child's reports 870-572-7294. Parents may use email to communicate with members of the school staff. Teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress. The school will provide to parents reports/report cards every four weeks with information regarding their child's academic progress and upcoming classroom and school events. The school will use the student handbook, school web site, school marquee and call cast system to communicate with parents and the community.

Barton High School will include in the school's policy handbook the school's process for resolving parental concerns, including how to define a problem, whom to approach first, and how to develop solutions.
